

Director Kent Traylor states, "The Bible Institute is preparing future pastors, missionaries, and Christian workers to serve throughout the world with the precious message of the Gospel. Former students and graduates are ministering in Oaxaca, Chiapas, Baja, Sonora, Jalisco, Sinaloa, other parts of Mexico, Tanzania, Africa, USA, and Honduras. Courses such as Synthesis of the Old Testament, Church Growth, Contemporary Thought, Christian Education, Methods of Bible Study, Spanish Grammar, and more are all taught in Spanish. Students come from different ethnic languages and backgrounds so the years spent at the institute are definitely a time of extended learning."

#### **TMI Established Churches**

There are 22 churches which have the covering of TMI. Each church must be compliant to the laws of Mexico and must belong to the Religious Association of TMI. Pastor Eufrasio Perez, President, is a great help in taking care of paper work and legal issues which apply to the individual churches. Each church has a national pastor, and it is the responsibility of the congregation to take care of their pastor. TMI seeks to encourage the churches by helping with building and various supplies, literature, and with visits from the leadership and small groups from time to time. We encourage





the comradery of the churches to work together in retreats, services, camps, fellowship times, and personal enrichment. The churches have different forms of outreach and helping to meet the needs of the community. Some pastors place an emphasis on global missions and the congregation is taught to give liberally for evangelism. Many lives are touched continually through this department of TMI. We are

always encouraged to hear the reports from the different churches, of God's enabling and His supply through times of difficulty and times of victory. The churches must stay in agreement with the Statement of Faith of TMI as they uphold the major doctrines of the Scriptures.



Director Ron Hoffman desires to personally visit the different TMI sites when it is possible. He made a quick trip to Oaxaca in June, to join the congregation of Puerta de Salvación church with pastor Edgar Velasco as they celebrated 30 years as a lighthouse in that area. Recognition was given to the late pastor Elpidio Pérez, who began the work in 1993. They rejoiced at God's faithfulness.

These congregations are representative of all the TMI churches.

#### Where Are the Needs and How Are They Met?

This quarter we have highlighted a few areas of ministry where the spiritual needs are the greatest. Each department or missionary couple seek to fulfill the Great Commission in sharing the Gospel message to those to whom they minister. They also have physical needs which are meet through your donations.

The Distribution Center at headquarters provides food, clothing and household goods to many on a monthly basis. The items are carefully sorted and prepared in boxes for distribution. The **Bible Correspondence Department** is sending the Word of God in both English and Spanish into many prisons where residents there are learning about the hope there is in Christ Jesus. These lessons also go into many Spanish speaking areas of North America. A request came recently from <u>Cuba wanting the lessons to share in their home Bible study</u>.



**Missionaries Carl & Kathy Olson** are working with those who have been released from prison and <u>who</u> <u>need encouragement</u> in re-entry as well as stability in their lives and Christian walk.

Jerry & Candis Bingham, TMI representatives, continue to share <u>the need for a broader scope of global</u> <u>missions</u> and the wonderful opportunity to be involved in the lives of others. The hearts of Jerry and Candis pulsate missions beyond our own comfortable circle. They have spent many years as dedicated missionaries in Mexico, Uganda Africa, and USA. In Chiapas, Mexico, Antonio & Hubeydi López dedicate themselves <u>to the needs of the remote area of</u> <u>Brasil.</u> To witness their ministry you would walk with them up and down the mountain trails over difficult terrain to visit people who are in the congregation or to take the Gospel to those unreached.

Missionaries Dan & Debbie Bender are challenged by continual contacts with refugees, recent converts, and those who are "searchers". They are asking God for wisdom and direction to help them plant a church for the Afghan people.



Pastor David & Lorena de Jesus Aguilar in Comalapa, Chiapas, seek to daily meet the <u>spiritual and emotional needs</u> of the community during these times of intense Cártel activity. There are days when they cannot leave their homes due to the violence throughout the city. They must remain strong in the Lord in order to minister to their congregations as well as to the unsaved who do not know the Lord as their Refuge.
